This course addresses the ways and means of acquiring the ability to assess your workplace for safety and the prevention of injury or illness.

Why do I need a White Card?

Under Queensland workplace health and safety laws, any person performing construction work in Queensland must have successfully completed a construction induction course for the industry, before they start work in any construction activity. Construction activities include:

About this Course

This unit of competency specifies the outcomes required to undertake Work Health and Safety (WHS) induction training within the Queensland construction industry. It requires the ability to demonstrate personal awareness of WHS legislative requirements, and the basic principles of risk management and prevention of injury and illness in the construction industry. This course is commonly known as White Card training.

All states and territories have agreed to implement the National Code of Practice for Induction for Construction Work which has been declared by Safe Work Australia. The result is a nationally consistent approach to construction induction training given to workers across Australia -- White Cards from any Australian state or territory are recognised nationally.

Learning Outcomes



- appropriate legislation requirements and responsibilities on the construction site
- basic concepts of Work Health and Safety plans
- understanding safe work method statements
- how to select and fit common PPE
- identifying physical building and construction hazards
- the basics of hazard identification, risk assessment and control
- the process of controlling hazards
- emergency procedures

Course Structure

To be assessed as competent, all assessment must be completed and deemed competent. Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be awarded the Statement of Attainment, as evidence that the formal training has been completed. Participants will also receive a Queensland Construction Induction card (White Card).

Resources/Methods of Delivery/Assessment

- Participants are provided with a Learner Guide.
- This course is delivered using both indoor and outdoor instruction.
- Assessment includes written responses and a practical, verbal assessment.

Replacement card (section 321 of the WHS regulation)

In the event a person has successfully completed:

- CPCWHS1001 'Prepare to work safely in the construction industry', or
- CPCCOHS1001A 'Work safely in the construction industry' (previous QLD Course); and the person's card has been declared lost, stolen or destroyed, then the RTO may issue a replacement card upon the card holder supplying a statement of attainment to the RTO and declaring the circumstances in which the card was lost, stolen, or destroyed.
