Unit Overview

This nationally recognised unit of competency equips participants with the skills and knowledge required to drive a multi-combination (MC) vehicle safely and legally within the transport and logistics industry.

The course includes both theoretical instruction and practical training to ensure drivers can operate MC vehicles under diverse road and work conditions. It addresses all safety protocols, operating procedures, and legislative requirements associated with multi-combination vehicle operation.

The training is delivered using a combination of classroom instruction, video demonstrations, and real-world vehicle operation scenarios.

Upon successful completion, participants will be awarded a Statement of Attainment for TLIC4006 which can then be presented to Queensland Transport to obtain your MC Class Licence.

Entry Requirements

Participants must:

- Be 20 years of age or older
- Hold a current and valid HR or HC licence
- Possess a USI (Unique Student Identifier) – [Apply here](#)
- Provide three (3) original forms of ID (see below)
- Wear closed-in safety footwear, long pants, long sleeve shirt, and high-vis clothing
- Bring required PPE if available: helmet, gloves, safety glasses (limited supply available onsite)
- Successfully complete an LLN (Language, Literacy & Numeracy) quiz

Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Prepare and plan for multi-combination vehicle operation
- Perform pre-operational checks and replenishment of fluids
- Apply hazard control strategies and anticipate traffic conditions
- Operate multi-combination vehicles in accordance with safety and road laws
- Monitor vehicle performance, adapt to varying load/road conditions
- Complete documentation and report faults or irregularities promptly
- Apply industry regulations, signage, and communication protocols

Assessment & Certification

Assessment includes:

- Written knowledge assessment
- Verbal questioning
- Practical demonstration of MC vehicle operation

Upon successful completion, participants will receive a Nationally Recognised Statement of Attainment for:

TLIC4006 – Drive Multi-Combination Vehicle Which can then be presented to the Department of Transport and Main Roads for the issuance of an MC licence.

Evidence of Identity

At least one category A document must be photographic and show a full name and date of birth (DOB)

A candidate must produce, and an assessor must sight, three matching, original, evidence of identity (EOI) documents before undertaking an assessment or reassessment.

The EOI documents must comprise either:

- One (1) Category A document and two (2) Category B documents, or
- Two (2) Category A documents and one (1) Category B document.
- The category A document must show your full name and date of birth. Certified photocopies will not be accepted.
- All documents must be current unless otherwise stated.
- At least one Category A document must be photographic and show a candidate's full name.
- At least one Category A or B document must show the candidate's signature and date of birth.
